- □ GPA B.S. in Art Education candidates must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher, as well as a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher in all studio and education courses.
- MAJOR RESIDENCY Students must complete a minimum of 15 upper-level studio credits in residence on the UW-Madison campus.
- □ SENIOR RESIDENCY Degree candidates must complete their last 30 credits in residence on the UW-Madison campus (includes online and study abroad), excluding retroactive credits and credits granted by examination.

Students are responsible for planning their program to satisfy all degree requirements. Exceptions or modifications will not be considered due to a lack of understanding or failure to meet requirements by anticipated graduation semester. It is the student's responsibility to always check their DARS after enrolling to assure selected classes are fulfilling requirements as expected.
